Modern economics assumes infinite, self-healing nature



Global agreements focus on pledges, not tangible outcomes



Progress without justice fails to deliver meaningful environmental change



By 2050, around 3 billion people will live in countries under ecological threats

One Planet, Too Many Red Lines

Current growth based economic system is failing to protect nature and communities.



US\$ 577B crops at pollinator risk



75% land, 85% wetlands altered



Agriculture drives 70% biodiversity loss



Land use emits 25% GHGs



66% oceans impacted; 90% fish overused




24k of 28k species threatened

Growth Looks Good, Reality Does Not. GDP is Rising, Disasters-linked Losses are Rising Faster!!





Global GDP rose from $$48T \rightarrow $110T$ (2005-2024)

Net gain/GDP declined: 89% → 85%

Gap widened from 11% → 15% of GDP lost

Economic growth increasingly offsets itself through development-led destruction

The Development-Destruction Trap

Extract > Collapse > Borrow > Repeat

GDP Growth Built on Ecological Loss, Undermines True Prosperity

Irreversible damage of nature, resource constraints led poverty cycle and resource constraints.

Imperfect-information based economic planning degrade natural resources (e.g. water, soil, forest and ecosystem).





Existential Threat: A Systemic Crisis Unfolding

Combined collapse of climate stability signals a systemic crisis threatening all lives

Ethical considerations eroded and equity ignored, undermining collective survival

Ethical and equitable governance reforms are urgently required, prioritizing ecological and human well-being











Crisis stems not from scientific gaps, but from failure in governance mechanisms

Survival window is dangerously closing, demanding immediate and just action

Humans Act As Trustees, Entrusted To Protect And Nurture The Earth Rather Than Claim Ownership Over It.







Violating these rights is both a moral and legal breach extending responsibility to the entire planet


Justice must expand beyond humans to encompass all life forms and ecosystems

Governments and society must **respect and protect nature's rights** as fundamental principles





Upholding Natural Rights Pillars

Every river, forest, coastline and mountain we protect is a shield for someone's home and future.












Unified Natural Rights Index (UNRI) of Most Polluted Cities

Codifying the rights of ecosystems to exist, thrive, and regenerate within national and international legal systems.

Preservation of people and their assets from harm, risk, or loss.

The act of aligning human actions with natural laws.

A stringent system of accountability that ensures justice-based outcomes, driven by nature-based knowledge and guidelines.

Transform society by shifting to regeneration, stewardship, and ecological harmony






Form the pillars on which rests the system of Natural Rights governance, centered on humans and nature.

Seeks to resolve natural resource-related disputes and governance imbalances through non-violent, inclusive, and equitable means.


Harness a strong sense of community, emphasizing collective responsibility of all inhabitants to maintain the welfare of community and the planet.


Today we took Natural Rights Led Governance to the beach.

Natural Rights in Practice: Global Precedents and Outcomes



1st country to recognize nature as a rights-bearing entity in its Constitution

Recognized the Whanganui River as a legal person

High Court declaration of rivers as living entities

Constitution gives right to sue on behalf of ecosystems

Ecuador

New Zealand

Bangladesh

Kenya

Outcome

Trustees can sue for violation of nature's rights

Outcome

Centers Indigenous stewardship and codifies ecosystem sovereignty

Outcome

Treats rivers as victims of harm and mandates active state protection

Outcome

Strong community-led environmental justice rulings grounded in constitutional rights




